KS16	Household spaces and accommodation type	<i>Scotland</i> Includes 3 columns on dwellings' characteristics and a column on intercensal change in household spaces. <i>Northern Ireland</i> Includes 3 columns on dwellings' characteristics.

KS18	Tenure/Tenure and Landlord	<i>Scotland</i> Titled 'Tenure and Landlord'. Uses different categorisation of tenure and includes columns on intercensal changes in occupied household spaces. <i>Northern Ireland</i> 'Living Rent free' included in appropriate 'rented' category instead of in 'Other'. Northern Ireland equivalent names used for 'Rented' categories.

KS25/24	Knowledge of Welsh/Irish	<p>These tables on language skills are available for Wales and Northern Ireland respectively. In England and Wales this table is numbered KS25, in Northern Ireland it is numbered KS24. The classification of language skills is slightly different in two tables. Note that information on Gaelic is provided in Scotland in KS06.</p>
