Most of the guide's references are to publications, but electronic datasets and databases are also included.

The guide, which will be updated annually, is available either as a web-based document, or print copies which can be obtained on request from the project team at the address below.

General sources

Women and Men in Britain is a series of briefings published by the Equal Opportunities Commission (EOC). It covers topics from pay and income to the work-life balance.

Social Trends, from the Office for National Statistics (ONS), paints a broad picture of British society today and the ways in which it is changing. ONS publishes many general sources of gender statistics including *Social Focus*, which looks in detail at particular groups including young people, children, and women and men.

Population, households and families

The most comprehensive sources of population statistics are administrative data from the registration of births, marriages, divorces and deaths.

Census of Population and Housing provides 10-yearly benchmark figures for demographic variables at detailed geographical levels. Data from the 2001 Census is being made available at the time of publishing. The National Statistics website is the best source of the most relevant and up-to-date statistics from the 2001 Census.

General Household Survey for Great Britain is one of a number of regular household-based surveys, together with *Continuous Household Survey* for Northern Ireland.

British Household Panel Survey gives longitudinal sources of statistics, as does *British Cohort Study*, which provides a valuable research resource by tracking the same individuals and/or households over time.

Education, training and qualifications

Differences between education systems mean that it can be difficult to find comparable statistics for education and training for the United Kingdom as a whole, or to combine information to obtain national estimates.

Education and Training Statistics for the United Kingdom, the annual publication from the Department for Education and Skills, does provide an integrated overview of statistics on education and training in the UK. It includes chapters covering a wide variety of topics including qualifications, destinations, and international comparisons.

National Child Development Study paints a picture linking earlier circumstances, including education, with the life of the individual at age 33.

The Scottish School Leavers' Survey covers education, training, schools and qualifications for those in Scotland.

Labour market

Labour Force Survey is the major household-based survey recording labour market data. It provides high-quality information using international definitions of economic activity, and records a wealth of other information.

Local Labour Force Survey uses annual data from the quarterly Labour Force Survey, with boosts to make up the annual local area data.

Labour Market Trends is a monthly journal that carries articles specific to particular groups in the labour market, such as part-timers, older workers, and women.

Annual Business Inquiry (formerly the Annual Employment Survey), is another major source that includes gender statistics on employees that can be cross-referenced with full or part-time status.

NOMIS, the on-line labour market database, offers gender statistics covering a wide range of geographies.

New Earnings Survey (one each for Great Britain and Northern Ireland), includes employees who are covered by the pay-as-you-earn (PAYE) schemes and provides comparisons for women and men.

Health and social care

Much of the substantial amount of material that is collected and published by gender on health and social care does not cover the United Kingdom as a whole.

Health and Personal Social Service Statistics for England, and ***Health and Personal Social Service Statistics for Northern Ireland*** give an overall view of many aspects of health, with gender data available in a variety of topic areas.

Health Statistics Wales contains text, graphics and tables that illustrate the range of health care services in Wales and also has gender data on a range of topics.

Hospital Episode Statistics is used by the Department of Health to analyse trends in morbidity and patterns of treatment, and to monitor and investigate the reasons for variations between regions and between Health Authority Districts.

Medical Research Council National Survey of Health and Development offers a longitudinal analysis of health in Great Britain, published by the Medical Research Council.

Psychiatric Morbidity Amongst Adults Living in Private Households reports on the prevalence of a range of mental disorders in the general household population of Great Britain.

Income and housing

Labour Market Trends and *New Earnings Survey* both give earnings information by gender.

Family Resources Survey collects information on the living standards and circumstances of private households in Great Britain, but because most of the published data are at the household level, gender difference information does not feature greatly.

There are similar problems with **housing** data, which also contains data mainly in terms of households not individuals.

General Household Survey gives gender information on socio-demographic topics.

Households Below Average Income: A Statistical Analysis uses income as an indicator of the living standards that individuals can attain.

Survey of English Housing provides information about a variety of housing topics and provides data split by gender.

Crime and justice

Administrative data are collected by the police, the courts, the probation service and prisons covering a range of topics including crimes committed, prosecutions, convictions, and sentences served. However, consistent coverage of the United Kingdom is not always possible.

British Crime Survey is one of the best-known sources of crime statistics. It covers people's experiences of crime, their perceptions of crime and their contact with the police. Data are often separated by gender, allowing comparisons between women's and men's experiences of crime as victims or criminals.

Crime Survey – Northern Ireland closely mirrors the format and the questions of the *British Crime Survey* and provides gender data and other equal opportunities variables.

Prison Statistics England and Wales are published annually and break down statistics on prison population, receptions and discharges; cross-referenced with other factors such as type of offence.

General Household Survey and *Continuous Household Survey* also include data on crime and justice from time to time.

Transport and the environment

Published statistics on transport and environmental issues contain only limited amounts of information by gender.

National Travel Survey is the main source in this guide. It provides a better understanding of the use of transport facilities made by different sectors of the community. Much of the analysis is broken down by gender.

International Passenger Survey provides a comprehensive guide to overseas travel and tourism.

Census looks at car ownership and travel to work.

Statistics on the **environment** tend to come from sources examining social attitudes.

British Social Attitudes Survey seeks to chart changes in British social values in relation to other changes in society, and includes occasional modules on the environment.

Survey of Public Attitudes to the Environment is produced by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and surveys public attitudes to quality of life and the environment. Statistics are broken down by gender and other equal opportunities variables.

Lifestyles

Statistics on the ways people spend their time, their leisure activities, and their reading and viewing habits, are covered in a number of sources.

Time Use Survey (2000) was the first official survey of its kind. Respondents completed diaries and questionnaires to provide a wealth of information and a unique insight into the daily lives of individuals and households within the United Kingdom.

General Household Survey and *British Social Attitudes Survey* both collect a range of information on lifestyles and behaviour, including trends over time.

Social Trends regularly looks at lifestyles.

Cultural Trends brings together an extensive range of information on the cultural sector.

International Passenger Survey provides data on travel and tourism that can be analysed by age, length of stay, spending, purpose of visit and destination as well as gender.

The 1970 British Cohort Study, originally the British Births Survey, includes everybody born in one week in 1970 (17,198 individuals). The aim is to record medical, physical, educational and social development, and to study their influence on the life cycle. Data were collected at birth, and from four follow-ups at ages five, 10, 16 and 26; *Twenty-something in the 1990s* reports on the 1996 survey. *Changing Britain: Changing Lives*, was published in February 2003 reports comparisons between the cohort members and others at comparable ages in the 1958 and 1946 birth cohort studies. The datasets are deposited with the Data Archive and a full list of publications is available from the Centre for Longitudinal Studies at the Institute of Education, University of London.

The original sample size was 10,262 adults. From 1999 additional samples were introduced in Scotland and Wales, and from 2001, in Northern Ireland. This book includes results from the first seven waves of the survey. It contains articles on several gender-related topics, including changes in household and family composition, the distribution of work and resources within couples and changes in economic activity and work. There are now eleven waves of the British Household Panel Survey available for analysis via the Data Archive and working papers on the survey are available from the Institute for Social and Economic Research at Essex University.

Different topics are covered each year, and articles on gender roles and differing attitudes of women and men are often included. For example, the 17th report from 2000/2001 includes a chapter looking at gender differences in attitudes to employment, politics, public spending, religion, marriage, cohabitation, sex and abortion. BSA has also covered a wide range of other topics relevant to equal opportunity, e.g. age differences in attitudes (17th report), tolerance towards minorities such as racial minorities and homosexuals (19th report) and attitudes to marriage and cohabitation and to teenage mothers (both 19th report). The dataset is available through the Data Archive making it possible to examine differences associated with age, sex, religion, education, class political orientation, family type, and marital status (among other factors).
