# 1 Introduction

This report updates the sources, indicators and deflators used, along with revised 1995 weights, in the measurement of gross domestic product (GDP) at constant 1995 prices from the output approach. It updates the information published in *Gross Domestic Product: Output approach (Gross Value Added) (GSS Methodology Series no. 15)*. The revised weights, published in this paper, were first used in the National Statistics publication *United Kingdom National Accounts The Blue Book, 2001 edition*.

In the United Kingdom national accounts, GDP at constant prices is measured in three ways: from output data, from expenditure data and from income data. These, together, are used to compile the definitive estimate of GDP. In 1998 the ONS adopted the European System of Accounts 1995 (ESA95) which, along with other coverage changes, resulted in the output measure of GDP at *factor cost* being now measured at *basic prices* and renamed *gross value added (GVA)*. Basic prices include taxes on the production process, whereas factor cost excludes them. The preferred measure of GDP is now at *market prices* (ie with no adjustment for taxes on expenditure or subsidies). Information on these changes and the other changes to the United Kingdom's economic accounts resulting from the adoption of ESA95 can be found in *United Kingdom National Accounts Concepts, Sources and Methods 1998 edition*.

## 2 Publication

### **Gross Domestic Product at constant prices by Gross Value Added Industry of Output**

Published estimates of GDP at 1995 prices in index number form take account of income and expenditure information as well as total output (GVA). Hence there is an implicit statistical discrepancy between GDP and the total of the industry analysis of output.

Quarterly GDP at market prices, along with very limited industry detail at basic prices, (see Table 5 series marked\*) are published in a National Statistics (NS) first release *Gross domestic product preliminary estimate*, about three and a half weeks after the end of the quarter. Basic price output indices for the broad industry groups along with GVA are published in the ONS first releases: *UK output, income and expenditure*, some seven weeks after the end of the quarter (see Table 5 series marked\*\* for the additional series in this release), and *Quarterly national accounts*, some eleven weeks after the end of the quarter. The latter release also includes output indices for twelve services groups (see Table 5 series marked\*\*\* for the additional series in this release).

The information on output indices is also available later in the *Monthly Digest of Statistics and Economic Trends*. The annual estimates of output by industry groups are published in the *United Kingdom National Accounts: The Blue Book* and the *Annual Abstract of Statistics*. (See also ONS Databank below.)

### **Index of Production**

Monthly data of output of the production industries is published in a NS monthly first release *Index of Production*, about five weeks after the end of the month. The information is also available later in the *Monthly Digest of Statistics and Economic Trends*. The annual estimates of output by industry sub-section are published in the *United Kingdom National Accounts: The Blue Book* and the *Annual Abstract of Statistics* (See also ONS Databank below).

### **Monthly Index of Services**

A monthly Index of Services (IoS), covering private sector and government output, is published in the experimental statistics area of the NS Website during its development stage. There is more work to be done before the IoS becomes a mainstream indicator. As a first step the monthly Index of Distribution (IoD) is published in a NS monthly first release *Index of Distribution* which comprises the top level IoD and indices for motor trades, wholesale and commission trades and the retail trade. The IoD and the IoS are estimated using the same data sources and methodology as the quarterly estimates of service industries included in GVA.

### **ONS Databank**

The output indices listed in Tables 4 and 5 are held on the ONS Databank and may be purchased either on paper or in computer readable form. ### **3 Notes to the Tables**

In the tables aggregates and sub-aggregates are printed above their constituent components, either in bold or shaded.

The weights shown in the tables are all rounded independently and hence aggregates may not necessarily equal the sum of their components.

#### **Table 1**

Table 1 shows the value added weights for 1995 analysed by the SIC(92) sections and subsections.

#### **Table 2**

Table 2 shows the quarterly indicators used, their sources and, where appropriate, the price index used in the deflation to constant prices, to measure GVA at constant 1995 basic prices analysed by the SIC(92). The value added weights for 1995 are also shown along with any annual indicators which are used.

#### **Table 3**

Table 3 gives an alternative analysis, by market sector, of the Index of Production. Each of the constituent IoP series is assigned a market sector, 'Consumer goods', 'Investment goods' or 'Intermediate goods', dependent on the nature of the commodity. These indices are then aggregated by market sector to build up a better understanding of the economic picture.

#### **Tables 4 and 5**

Tables 4 and 5 list the constant 1995 price output indices (1995=100) which are available on the ONS Databank along with their Databank identifiers.
