

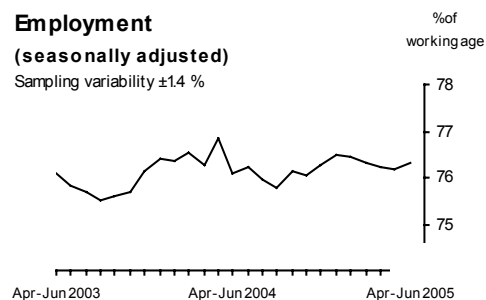

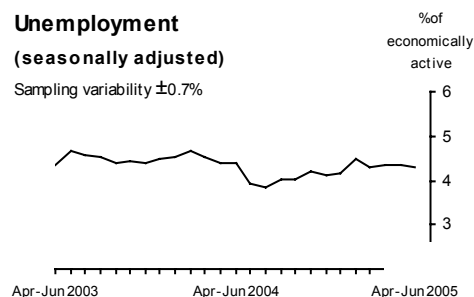
Labour market statistics August 2005: East Midlands

All data are not seasonally adjusted unless otherwise specified

Labour Force Survey data for the East Midlands indicate the trend in the employment rate is broadly flat, and the latest rate is not significantly different from a year ago. The trend in the unemployment rate appears to be increasing after recently falling, but the latest rate is not significantly different from a year ago.



Data for the three months to June 2005 show the seasonally adjusted employment rate at 76.3 per cent, up 0.2 percentage points on a year earlier. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.3 per cent, down 0.1 percentage point on a year earlier.



The seasonally adjusted claimant count was up in the year to July 2005.

April to June 2005 data: latest three-month average LFS results;

July 2005 data: claimant count.

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Employment (tables 1 to 6)

The seasonally adjusted LFS estimate of employment in the East Midlands was 76.3 per cent in the April to June 2005 period, up 0.2 percentage points on the same period a year earlier. The employment level was 2.08 million in the April to June 2005 period, up 30,000 on the same period a year earlier.

LFS estimates indicate a decrease in the number of employees and an increase in the number of self employed over the past year.

LFS estimates suggest an increase in the number of full-time workers and a decrease in the number of part-time workers over the past year.

Seasonally adjusted employee jobs figures were up 10,000 in the quarter to March 2005.

Not seasonally adjusted employee jobs were up 3,000 in the year to March 2005. This was mainly due to a rise in the service and 'other' industries, offset by a fall in the manufacturing and construction industries.

Unemployment (table 1)

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in the East Midlands was 4.3 per cent in the April to June 2005 period, down 0.1 percentage point on the same period a year earlier. The rates for men and women in April to June 2005 were 4.8 per cent and 3.7 per cent respectively.

Change on year from March 2004



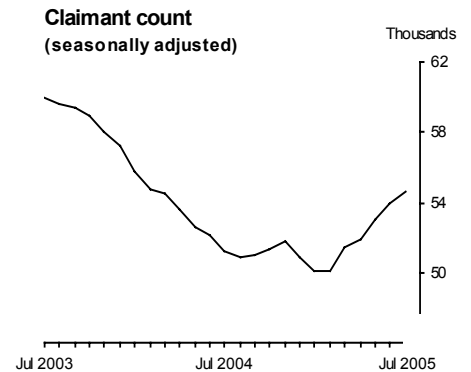

Claimant count (tables 7 and 8)

The seasonally adjusted claimant count rate in July 2005 was 2.6 per cent, unchanged from June 2005, and up 0.2 percentage points since July 2004. The seasonally adjusted number of claimants in July 2005 was 54,600, up 700 on June 2005, and up 3,400 since July 2004. The not seasonally adjusted number of claimants was 54,500 in July 2005.



The not seasonally adjusted number of computerised claims of people aged 18 to 24 was 15,800 in July 2005, up 2,000 over the year. The number of computerised claims has fallen over the year for most age and duration groups.

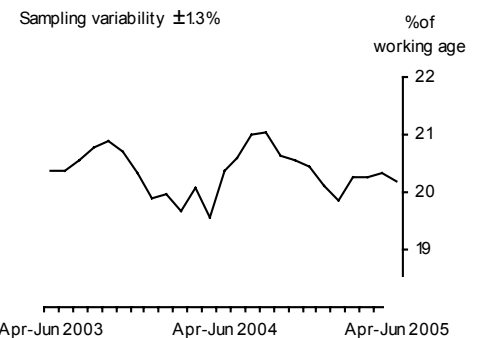
Economically active (tables 1 and 9)

The seasonally adjusted LFS estimate of economically active people in the East Midlands was 2.18 million in the April to June 2005 period.

Economically inactive (tables 1, 10 and 11)

The seasonally adjusted working age economic inactivity rate in the East Midlands in April to June 2005 was 20.2 per cent, down 0.2 percentage points from a year earlier.

Economic inactivity (working age) (seasonally adjusted)



The level of economically inactive people in the April to June 2005 period was 1.25 million, with 532,000 of these of working age, down 1,000 on the same period a year earlier.

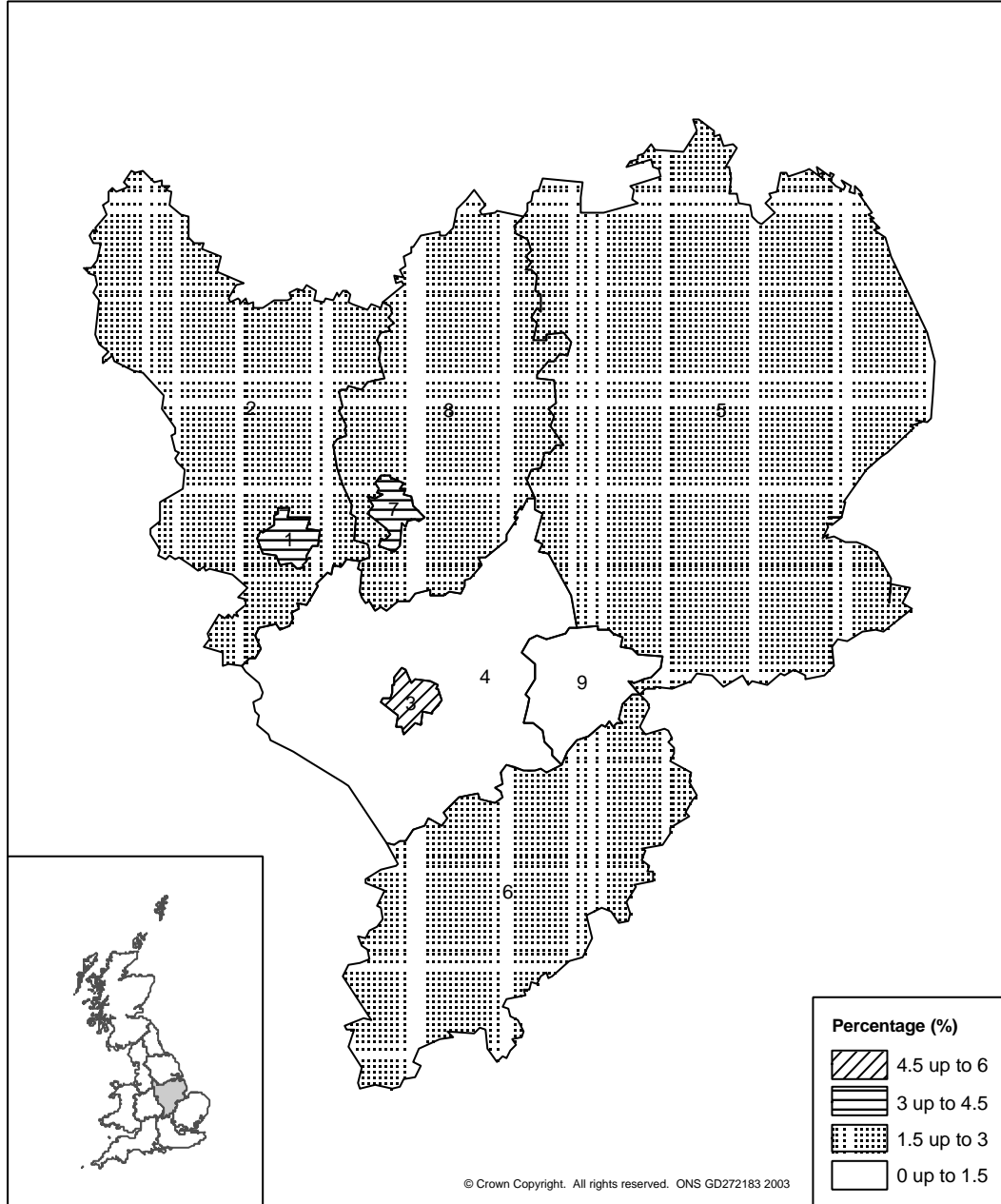
Local area data (table 16)

The claimant count as a proportion of the resident working age population was lowest in Rutland UA, at 0.6 per cent. It was highest in Leicester UA, at 4.8 per cent.

REVISIONS

General

One indication of the reliability of the key indicators in this release can be obtained by monitoring the size of revisions. The tables below record the size and pattern of revisions which have occurred over the last five years. Please note that these indicators only report summary measures for revisions. The revised data may itself be subject to sampling or other sources of error. The ONS standard presentation is to show five years worth of revisions (ie 60 observations for a monthly series, 20 for a quarterly series). The first table covers Employment and Unemployment data first published from August 1999 to July 2004 and Claimant Count data first published from August 1999 to July 2004. The second table covers workforce jobs data first published from January 2000 to July 2002. As more data are published a full five years worth of comparisons will be included for all series. THIS MONTH

Economic inactivity

A review of LFS questions on reasons for inactivity has been carried out to assure interviewee responses are recorded effectively. Minor modifications in the questionnaire have led to changes in the way that people respond to inactivity, affecting only three series in Table 11 (Economic inactivity: reasons): 'Discouraged Workers', 'Retired' and 'Other.' This month we are seeing the effects of this in the data where the number of inactive people citing 'Retired' as a reason has increased significantly and the number of 'Other' and 'Discouraged' have reduced as expected.

NEXT MONTH

Revised LFS estimates

On 25 August 2005, ONS will publish the mid-year population estimate (MYE) for 2004. These population estimates will be incorporated into the LFS estimates (for Jul-Sep 2003 to date) due to be published in next month's Labour Market First Release, on 14 September 2005.

Seasonal Adjustment Review

Next month's release on 14 September will incorporate the results of the latest regular review of seasonal adjustment of the LFS series. Revisions to all LFS series can be expected to the figures for the past three years. The impact of the seasonal adjustment review on the data is very small.

Local labour market indicators

Tables 12 to 15, local labour market indicators, will be updated to include labour supply data from the first 2004 Annual Population Survey published on 28 July 2005.

SPECIAL

Population estimates in the LFS

On 9 September 2004, ONS published the mid-year population estimate (MYE) for 2003, along with revised mid-year estimates for 2001 and 2002. These estimates take into account the results of population studies announced by ONS in July 2004. The population studies were designed to improve population estimates in areas that had proved hardest to count in the 2001 census, leading to revisions in 15 local authority areas. The Government Actuary's Department (GAD) published revised projections for 2004 and later years, based on the revised population estimates, on 30 September 2004. Revised

population estimates for 1992-2000 were published by ONS on 7 October 2004. Further information is available on the website.

Tables 12 to 15: Local labour market indicators

Tables 12 to 15 present a framework of labour market statistics for local areas. Data are presented as indicators of labour supply, labour demand and benefits. This structure adheres to the labour accounting system described in the Framework Review of Labour Market Statistics published on 5 August 2002 (see http://www.statistics.gov.uk/methods_quality/quality_review/downloads/LMSFR_Final.doc).

These tables include data from the annual local area Labour Force Survey. These data are weighted to population estimates which were released in February 2003, not the latest revised population estimates. Interim reweighting of monthly LFS estimates at national and regional level has been applied in order to take account of the revised population data. For the annual local area LFS data such an interim reweighting is not possible. (see background note 2).

Sampling variability and trends

Some data in this release are based on statistical samples and, as such, are subject to sampling variability. If many samples were drawn, each would give a different result. The ranges shown for the LFS data in this release and in the following table represent '95 per cent confidence intervals'. It is expected that in 95 per cent of samples the range would contain the true value. For more information, see the *Guide to Labour Market Statistics Releases*.

BACKGROUND NOTES

1. The LFS sample population covers those living in private households, student halls of residence and NHS accommodation.
2. Annual local area data from the LFS are included in Tables 12 to 15. All LFS micro-data have been reweighted to be consistent with post census population estimates, which were published in February 2003. However, during this reweighting exercise, revised population estimates were released, in September 2003. The quarterly, regional LFS data in this release have been interim reweighted to the latest (September 2003) population estimates, but for local area data such an interim reweighting is not possible. The LFS data in Tables 12 to 15 are therefore not consistent with the quarterly LFS data published elsewhere in the release.

The annual LFS database is compiled by taking data from waves one and five of four quarters of the LFS and combining them with an additional sample of interviews. This sample boost was introduced in 2000 and has improved the accuracy of the annual estimates for some local areas in England and all local areas in Wales (a boost was also introduced in Scotland for the 2003/04 survey, and the results of this survey were published on 24 November 2004.). There are now different publication thresholds for annual LFS data, depending on the size of the sample boost in the area. The thresholds are six thousand, four thousand, two thousand and as low as one thousand for some areas in Wales. For further information see Volume 6 of the *LFS User Guide*. 3. Not seasonally adjusted claimant count data are gathered from an administrative source and constitute a complete count. However, seasonally adjusted totals are presented as rounded to the nearest hundred to avoid spurious precision.
4. Claimant count flows are the number of people joining or leaving the count in the period between the count dates. They are therefore affected by the number of weeks between count dates. To enable comparisons from month to month, the flows figures are standardised to a 4.33-week month before seasonal adjustment.
5. The number of Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) claimants can be expressed as a proportion of either (a) the corresponding mid-year estimate (or the latest available mid-year estimate) of the workforce jobs in the area plus the number of claimants, or (b) the resident working age population. The number of workforce jobs is mainly collected through postal employer surveys and comprises employee jobs, self-employment jobs, HM armed forces and government-supported trainees and is used to calculate rates for regions and the countries of the UK. For smaller areas, proportions based on the resident working age populations are used.
6. The count of JSA claimants is mostly derived from the Jobcentre Plus computer records. However for various reasons, e.g. when a claimant's National Insurance number is not known, a few claims have to be dealt with manually by local offices. These claims, which amount to less than 1 per cent of the total, are thus counted separately and not analysed in as much detail as the computerised claims. In particular, only the computerised claims are analysed by age and duration on a monthly basis.

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7. Travel-to-Work areas (Table 14) are approximations to self-contained labour markets, i.e. areas where people both live and work.
8. NUTS (Nomenclature des Unités Territoriales Statistiques) (Table 15) was established by the Statistical Office of the European Union (Eurostat) to provide a uniform breakdown of territorial units for the production of regional statistics. NUTS is a five-level hierarchical classification.
9. The employee jobs series is based on data from employer surveys and is subject to sampling variability. The nature of the survey means that the size of this sampling variability may not be consistent from year to year. Provisionally ONS would expect that the 95 per cent confidence interval would on average be within +/- 6 per cent of the estimate. However, this will vary from region to region.
10. Labour market statistics are compiled from a wide range of sources. Claimant count data are provided from the Jobcentre Plus administrative system, workforce jobs are derived from ONS business surveys, other data come from the ONS Labour Force Survey.
11. The Social and Vital Statistics Division of ONS carries out the questionnaire design, sample selection and interviewing for the LFS. Analysis and publication of the results of the survey is undertaken by Labour Market Division. In Northern Ireland, the Labour Force Survey is conducted by the Central Survey Unit.
12. In addition to the data in this release, ONS can provide a wide range of detailed labour market data in a number of formats. In particular, data are available from Nomis[®] at the same time as this release is published. Further data are also published in *Labour Market Trends (LMT)* and the *Labour Force Survey Quarterly Supplement to LMT*.
