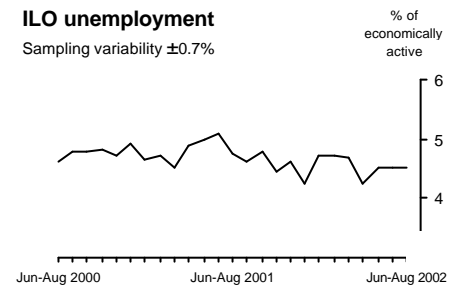
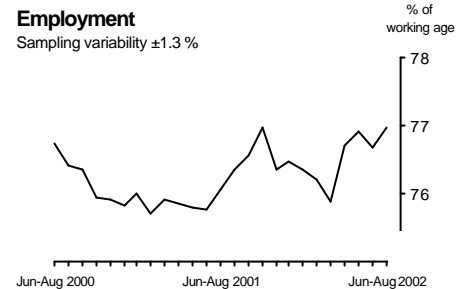
October 2002: East Midlands

All data are adjusted for seasonality unless otherwise specified

Latest Labour Force Survey data over the year to August 2002 indicate employment and unemployment stable in the East Midlands.

Data for the three months to August 2002 show the employment rate at 77.0 per cent, up 0.9 percentage points on a year earlier. The unemployment rate was 4.5 per cent, down 0.2 percentage points on a year earlier.

The claimant count was down in the year to September 2002.

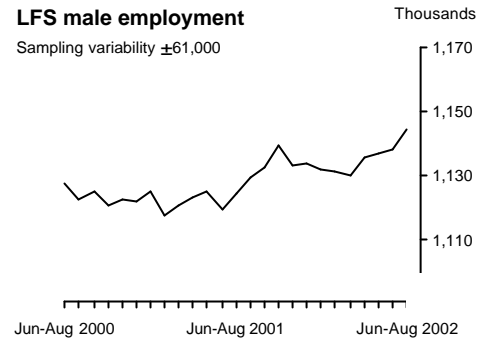

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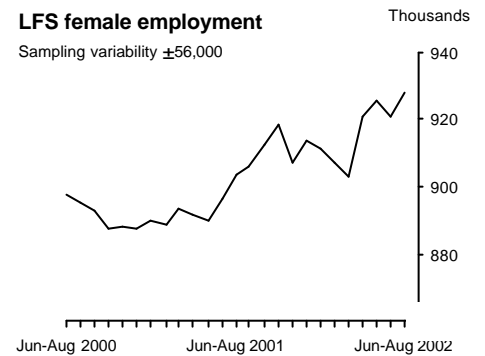
Employment (tables 1 to 6)

The LFS estimate of employment in the East Midlands was 77.0 per cent in the June to August 2002 period, up 0.9 percentage points on the same period a year earlier. The employment level was 2.07 million in the June to August 2002 period, up 44,000 on the same period a year earlier.



Unadjusted LFS estimates indicate an increase in the number of employees and a decrease in the number of self-employed over the past year.

Unadjusted LFS estimates suggest an increase in both the number of full-time and part-time workers over the past year.

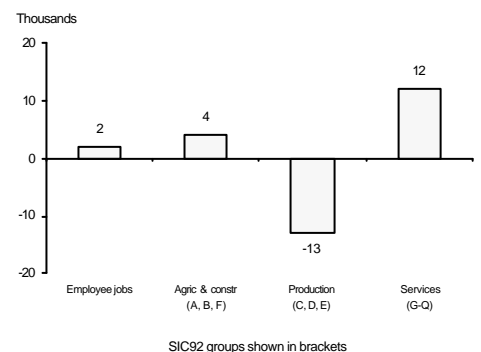


Seasonally adjusted employee jobs figures were down 5,000 in the quarter to June 2002.

Unadjusted employee jobs were up 2,000 in the year to June 2002. This was mainly due to rises in construction and other industries, offset by a fall in the manufacturing sector.

Unemployment (table 1)

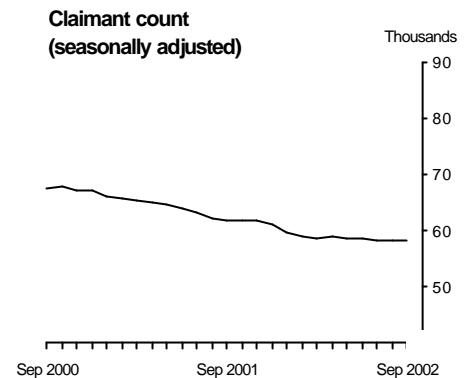
The ILO rate of unemployment in the East Midlands was 4.5 per cent in the June to August 2002 period, down 0.2 percentage points on the same period a year earlier. The rates for men and women in June to August 2002 were both 4.5 per cent.

Claimant count (tables 7 and 8)

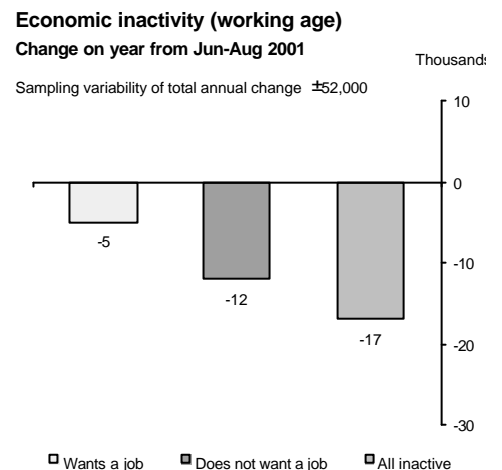
The claimant count rate in September 2002 was 2.9 per cent, unchanged from August 2002, and down 0.2 percentage points since September 2001. The seasonally adjusted number of claimants in September 2002 was 58,300, unchanged on August 2002, and down 3,500 since September 2001. The unadjusted number of claimants was 57,300 in September 2002.



The unadjusted number of computerised claims of people aged 18 to 24 was 15,400 in September 2002, down 400 over the year. The number of computerised claims has fallen over the year for most age and duration groups.

Economically active (tables 1 and 9)

There were 2.17 million economically active people in the East Midlands in the June to August 2002 period.

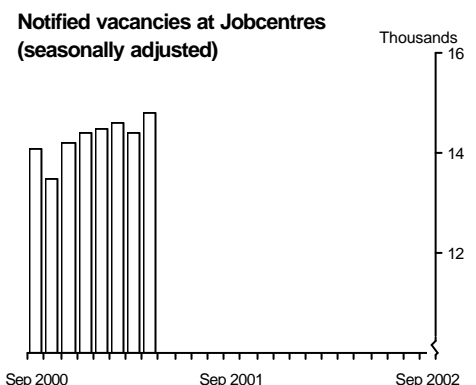


Economically inactive (tables 1, 10 and 11)

The LFS estimate of economically inactive people in the East Midlands in the June to August 2002 period was 1.19 million, with 505,000 of these of working age. Over the year the number of economically inactive people of working age was down 17,000.

Vacancies (table 12)

Publication of the Jobcentre vacancy series has been deferred. Figures from May 2001 are affected by the introduction of Employer Direct – see note on page 5.

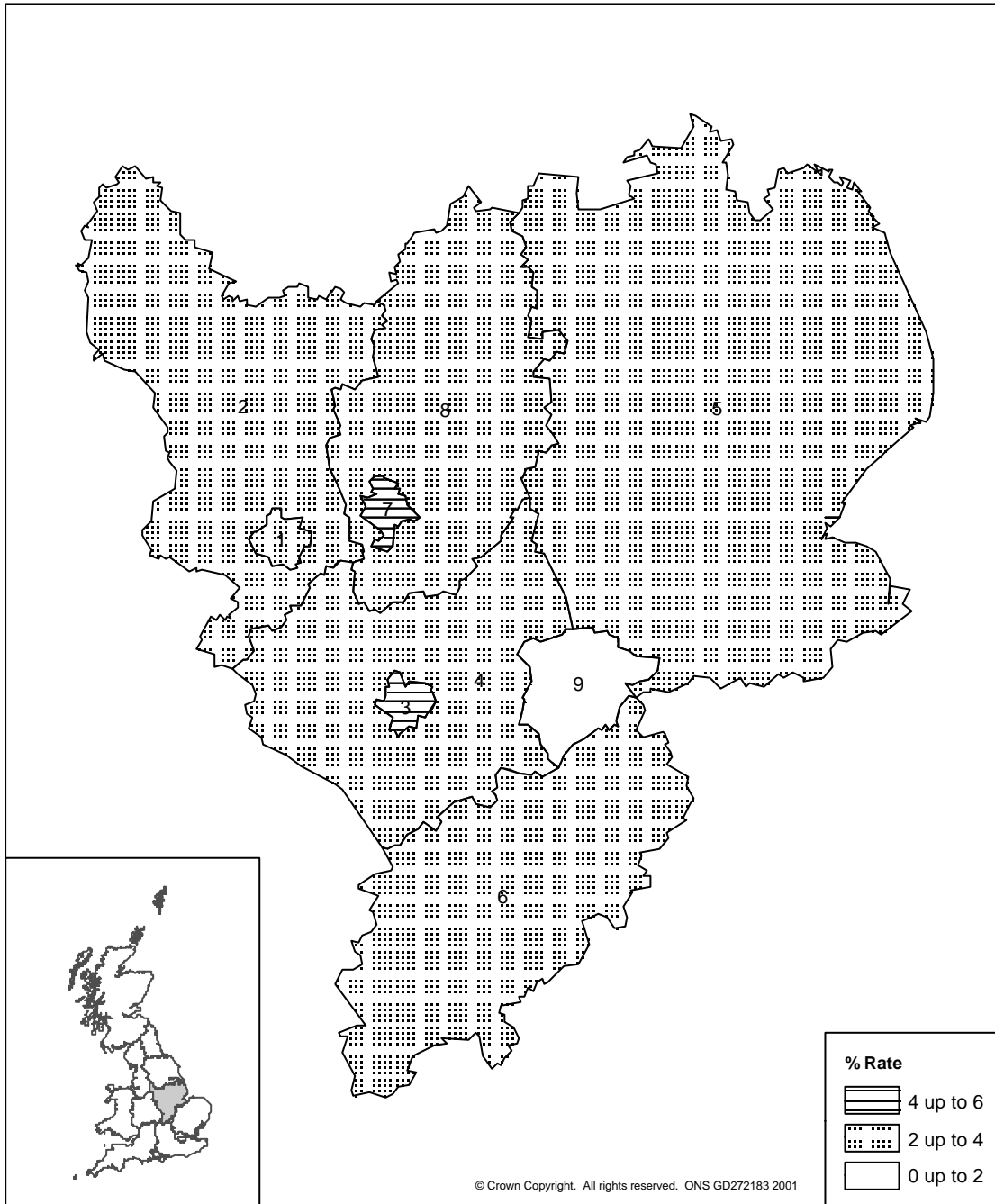


Local area data (tables 13 to 16)

The unadjusted claimant count rate was lowest in Rutland UA, at 0.6 per cent. It was highest in Bolsover, at 5.1 per cent.

REVISIONS

Workforce jobs

ONS has now completed the work needed to revise the Annual Business Inquiry results for December 1998 and December 1999. The regional workforce jobs published this month take on board these revisions. In addition, the opportunity has been taken to improve the linking between the latest data and the pre-1998 results, which were based on the old Annual Employment Survey. The methodology for interpolating the results between the annual benchmarks is also being changed. As a result, regional workforce jobs this month are being revised as far back as 1981, though the differences are relatively small at an all industries level.

NEXT MONTH

Annual local area data from the Labour Force Survey covering the period March 2001 to February 2002 will be published on 13 November 2002. Table 13 will be updated to include the new data. The data were weighted using the latest available population data at the time of production. Hence they are not consistent with the 2001 mid-year estimates based on the 2001 Census, which were published on 10 October 2002.

SPECIAL

Interim revised Labour Force Survey estimates consistent with the 2001 Census

On 30 October 2002, ONS will publish on the National Statistics website revised LFS estimates at UK level for the period March-May 1992 to June-August 2002. These will take account of the interim revised mid-year population estimates which were published on 10 October 2002, and which take into account the results of the 2001 Census.

Annual interim revised LFS estimates for the period 1984 to 1991 will also be published on the website on 30 October or very soon after this. These 1984-1991 series will be at a higher aggregate level than the revised 1992-2002 series.

On 13 November 2002, ONS will publish LFS estimates for the UK, for the period July-September 2002, consistent with the historical series to be published on 30 October.

No interim revised mid-year estimates for 1982-2000 are available below national level and it is therefore not possible to produce revised LFS series below national level. The Regional Labour Market First Releases from November 2002 until early 2003 will be published containing 'not seasonally adjusted' data consistent with pre-Census mid-year population estimates. These publications

will carry prominent warnings about the lack of comparability between these data and the interim, revised national figures.

On 21 November 2002, the Government Actuary's Department (GAD) will produce interim 2001 based national population projections. Therefore, from December 2002, the published interim LFS estimates for the latest periods will use these official GAD interim projections.

In February 2003, ONS will publish final mid-year population estimates for 1991 to 2000, and in March 2003 the equivalent estimates for the period 1982 to 1990. These will be incorporated in the LFS interim estimates as soon as possible thereafter. In particular, this should enable interim revised series to be published at regional level which are consistent with the national series.

ONS will complete a full re-weighting of all LFS series and databases by summer 2003. This will allow the interim revised series to be replaced by final estimates.

Extra Jubilee Bank Holiday

The figures for total and average hours in table 6 cover the period which includes the extra Jubilee Bank Holiday. Users should be cautious when interpreting movements involving June data.

Vacancy data

Publication of the Jobcentre vacancy series has been deferred due to distortions to the data as a result of the introduction of Employer Direct by Jobcentre Plus. This release contains vacancy data only up to April 2001.

A limited range of statistics on Jobcentre Plus vacancies, relating to the inflows of newly-notified vacancies, is now being made available on Nomis®, though not at this stage as National Statistics. (For further details see the news and research item on page 455 of the September 2002 issue of *Labour Market Trends*.)

The introduction of Employer Direct, a major change which involves transferring the vacancy-taking process from local Jobcentres to regional Customer Service Centres, has affected the data since May 2001. Employer Direct has been gradually introduced across Great Britain as part of modernising the former Employment Service (now part of Jobcentre Plus) and has had the following effects:

- A temporary reduction in the recorded level of outflows and placings owing to some delays in following up vacancies with employers associated with the introduction of the new arrangements.

- An increase in the recorded level of newly-notified vacancies.
- Both the above effects have led to an increase in the recorded stock of unfilled vacancies.

Investigations have shown these effects are substantial for all the vacancy series. While they cannot be quantified precisely, the effects are large enough to prevent meaningful comparisons with earlier data. Some of the distortions will also persist for a while after the full implementation of Employer Direct, which was completed in all regions at the end of January 2002. Publication of the Jobcentre vacancy series has therefore been deferred. ONS and the Department for Work and Pensions are continuing to monitor and review the data with the aim of reinstating the series as soon as possible.

The publication of the vacancy figures for Northern Ireland has been suspended since March 1999 as a result of a discontinuity identified during the introduction of a new computer system for processing vacancies to local offices of the Department for Employment and Learning (DEL). In the course of correcting for this difficulty, further problems of a procedural nature came to light as contributory factors. These further issues have delayed the reinstatement of published vacancy figures for Northern Ireland. DEL have now introduced a new internet-based operational system for vacancies and have resumed publication of some non-seasonally adjusted vacancy data for Northern Ireland on a provisional basis. For the purposes of the seasonally adjusted United Kingdom figures it has been assumed provisionally that the Northern Ireland figures have remained constant since February 1999 as follows: 8,900 for the stock of unfilled vacancies, 3,400 for inflows of vacancies notified, 3,400 for outflows, and 2,200 for placings. These are not estimates for Northern Ireland but assumptions for the purpose of continuity of the United Kingdom series up to April 2001.

Claimant Count

The introduction of Joint Claims for Jobseeker's Allowance, on 19 March 2001, has had an upward effect on the claimant count. ONS estimates that the total impact on the count, which accumulated between April and August 2001, has been some 600 in the East Midlands region (approximately 200 men and 400 women) and 6,500 for the UK overall (approximately 2,200 men and 4,300 women).

The introduction of Joint Claims means that both members of certain couples are now required to claim JSA jointly and both are required to look for work. This applies to couples without dependent children where at least one member was born after 19 March 1976 and is aged over 18. The claimant count continues to include all individual claimants, so there are some extra claimants included as a result of this change.

It has been announced that Joint Claims for JSA will be extended in October 2002 to couples without dependent children where at least one member was born after 1957. The extent to which the introduction of Joint Claims may be treated as a discontinuity in the count, following past precedent, is difficult to assess at this stage but we will continue to monitor and review the effects. For information about previous treatment of discontinuities in the claimant count see, for example, the article '*Changes to the coverage of the monthly count of claimant unemployment*' in *Labour Market Trends*, November 1995, page 398.

2. Some data in this release are based on statistical samples and, as such, are subject to sampling variability. If many samples were drawn, each would give a different result. Data from waves one and five of four quarters of the LFS were combined with an additional sample of interviews, in England, which improves the accuracy of the annual estimates for some local areas in England. Estimates of sampling variability - '95 per cent confidence intervals' - for each region, county, unitary authority and local authority district are shown in the table. There are now three publication thresholds - two thousand and four thousand, in addition to six thousand. For further information see Volume 6 of the *LFS User Guide*. - Unadjusted claimant count and vacancies data are gathered from administrative sources and constitute a complete count. However, seasonally adjusted totals are presented as rounded to the nearest hundred to avoid spurious precision. Any differences between the sum of the rounded seasonally adjusted figures and the UK totals are due to this rounding.
- Claimant count flows are the number of people joining or leaving the count in the period between the count dates. They are therefore affected by the number of weeks between count dates. To enable comparisons from month to month, the flows figures are standardised to a 4.33-week month before seasonal adjustment.

7. A claimant count rate is defined as the number of claimants resident in an area as a percentage of the corresponding mid-year estimate (or the latest available mid-year estimate, currently for June 2000) of the sum of claimants and workforce jobs in the area. The number of workforce jobs is mainly collected through postal employer surveys and comprises employee jobs, self-employment jobs, HM armed forces and government-supported trainees. Note that the technical basis of these rates has been reviewed as part of the National Statistics Quality Review of the Framework for Labour Market Statistics and ONS will publish, by 5 November 2002, an action plan relating to the recommendations of the Review. 8. The count of Jobseeker's Allowance claimants is mostly derived from the Jobcentre Plus computer records. However for various reasons, e.g. when a claimant's National Insurance number is not known, a few claims have to be dealt with manually by local offices. These claims, which amount to less than 1 per cent of the total, are thus counted separately and not analysed in as much detail as the computerised claims. In particular, only the computerised claims are analysed by age and duration on a monthly basis.
9. Travel-to-Work areas (table 15) are approximations to self-contained labour markets, i.e. areas where people both live and work.
10. NUTS (Nomenclature des Unités Territoriales Statistiques) (table 17) was established by the Statistical Office of the European Union (Eurostat) to provide a uniform breakdown of territorial units for the production of regional statistics. NUTS is a five-level hierarchical classification.
11. The employee jobs series is based on data from employer surveys and is subject to sampling variability. The nature of the survey means that the size of this sampling variability may not be consistent from year to year. Provisionally ONS would expect that the 95 per cent confidence interval would, on average, be within +/- 6 per cent of the estimate. However, this will vary from region to region.
12. Labour market statistics are compiled from a wide range of sources. Claimant count and Jobcentre vacancy data are provided from the Jobcentre Plus administrative system; workforce jobs are derived from ONS business surveys; other data come from the ONS Labour Force Survey.
13. The Social Survey Division of ONS carries out the questionnaire design, sample selection and interviewing for the LFS. Analysis and publication of the results of the survey is

undertaken by Labour Market Division. In Northern Ireland, the Labour Force Survey is conducted by the Central Survey Unit.

14. In addition to the data in this release, ONS can provide a wide range of detailed labour market data in a number of formats.
