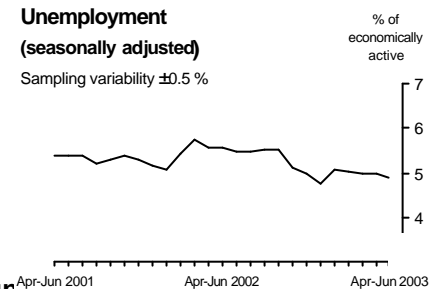
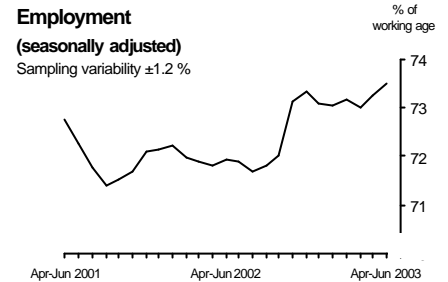
August 2003: North West

All data are not seasonally adjusted unless otherwise specified

Latest Labour Force Survey data over the year to June 2003 indicate employment increasing and unemployment stable in the North West.

Data for the three months to June 2003 show the seasonally adjusted employment rate at 73.5 per cent, up 1.5 percentage points on a year earlier. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.9 per cent, down 0.7 percentage points on a year earlier.

The seasonally adjusted claimant count was down in the year to July 2003.

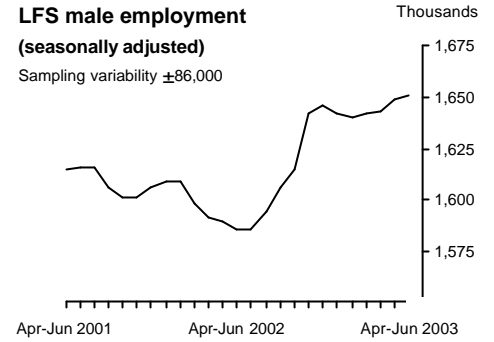

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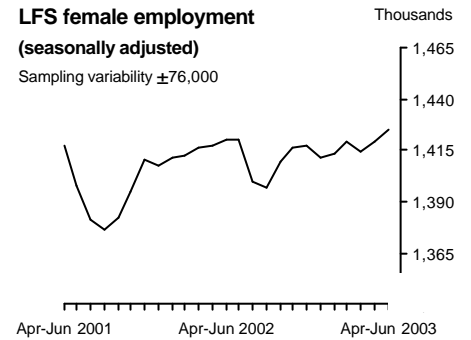


Employment (tables 1 to 6)

The seasonally adjusted LFS estimate of employment in the North West was 73.5 per cent in the April to June 2003 period, up 1.5 percentage points on the same period a year earlier. The employment level was 3.08 million in the April to June 2003 period, up 70,000 on the same period a year earlier.



Seasonally adjusted employee jobs figures were down 4,000 in the quarter to March 2003.



Not seasonally adjusted employee jobs were up 8,000 in the year to March 2003. This was mainly due to rises in the services and 'other' industries, partly offset by a fall in the manufacturing industry.

Unemployment (table 1)

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in the North West was 4.9 per cent in the April to June 2003 period, down 0.7 percentage points on the same period a year earlier. The rates for men and women in April to June 2003 were 5.5 and 4.2 per cent respectively.

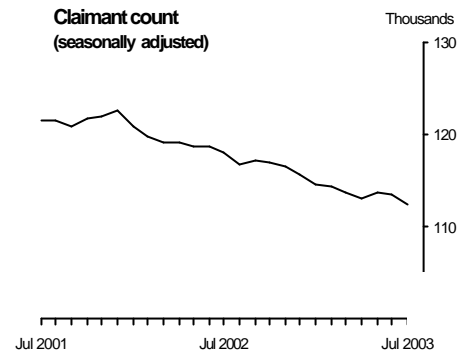

Claimant count (tables 7 and 8)

The seasonally adjusted claimant count rate in July 2003 was 3.4 per cent, unchanged from June 2003, and down 0.2 percentage points since July 2002. The seasonally adjusted number of claimants in July 2003 was 112,500, down 1,000 on June 2003, and down 5,600 since July 2002. The not seasonally adjusted number of claimants was 113,700 in July 2003.



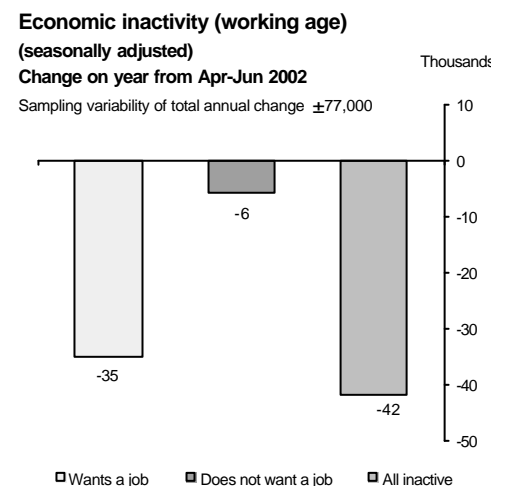
The not seasonally adjusted number of computerised claims of people aged 18 to 24 was 34,400 in July 2003, down 500 over the year. The number of computerised claims has fallen over the year for most age and duration groups.

Economically active (tables 1 and 9)

The seasonally adjusted LFS estimate of economically active people in the North West was 3.23 million in the April to June 2003 period.

Economically inactive (tables 1, 10 and 11)

The seasonally adjusted LFS estimate of economically inactive people in the North West in the April to June 2003 period was 2.04 million, with 923,000 of these of working age. Over the year the number of economically inactive people of working age was down 42,000.



Vacancies (table 12)

Publication of the seasonally adjusted Jobcentre vacancy series has been deferred. Figures from May 2001 are affected by the introduction of Employer Direct – see note on page 9.

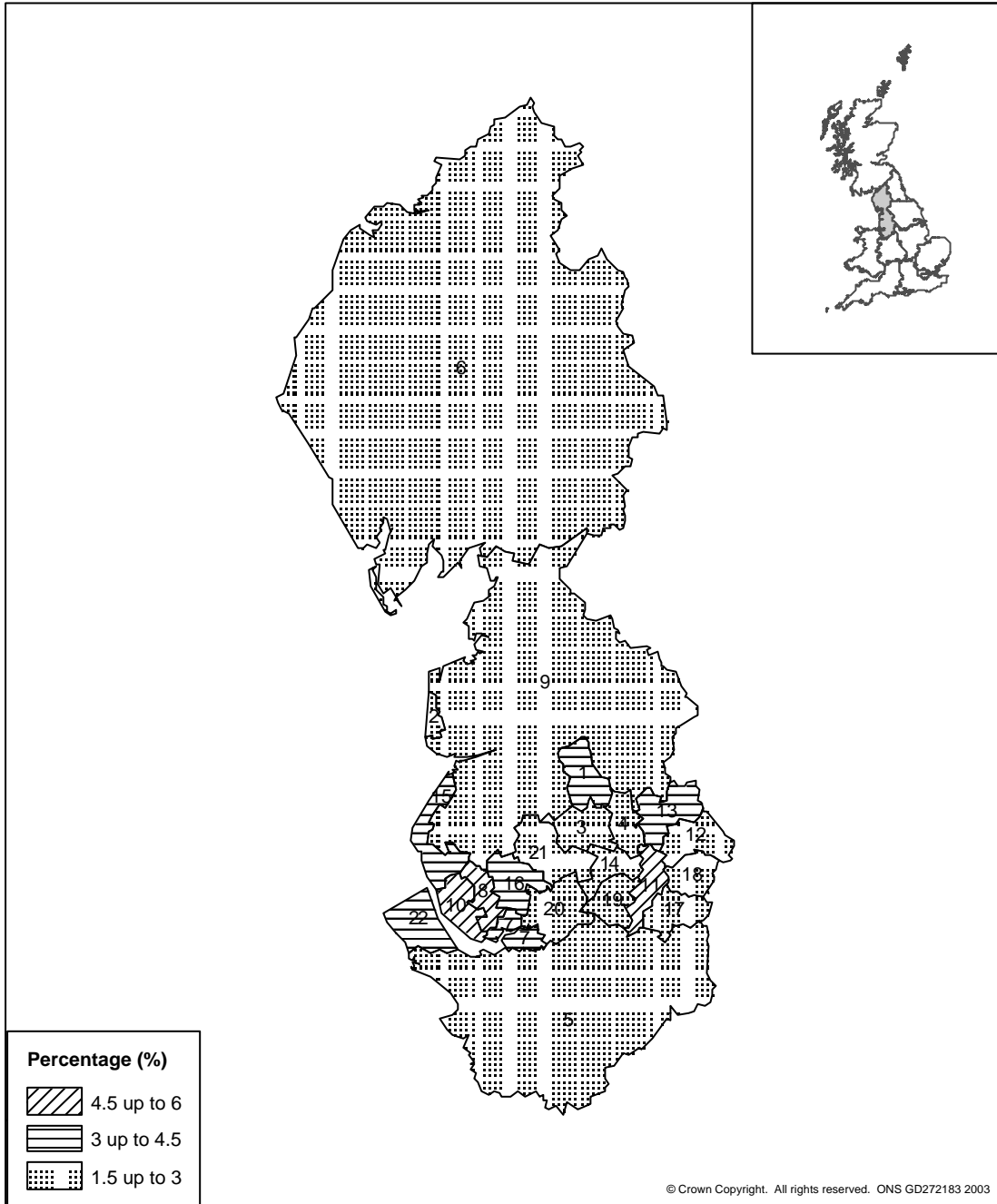
Local area data (table 17)

The claimant count as a proportion of the resident working age population was lowest in Ribble Valley, at 0.6 per cent. It was highest in Liverpool, at 5.5 per cent.

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REVISIONS

There are no significant revisions this month to the data in this release.

NEXT MONTH

In September's release, Tables 14 and 15 will include jobs density and claimant count proportion data which have not been previously available. The population denominators, necessary to produce these indicators, will be derived from population data for output areas, from the 2001 Census. These data were published on 30 June 2003. They will also allow claimant count proportions for parliamentary constituencies, for the latest month, to be published in Table 18. Claimant count proportions for the latest period, for travel-to-work areas, will be published on Nomis[®].

SPECIAL

New tables presenting a labour market framework for local areas

In July's release four new tables were introduced (one for each of the four local area geographies: local authorities, parliamentary constituencies, travel-to-work areas and NUTS 3 areas) which present a framework of labour market statistics in order to give a better overall picture of the labour market for the local area. The tables are structured to present indicators on labour supply, labour demand and claimants of the Jobseekers' Allowance (JSA) working age benefit. This structure adheres to the labour accounting system described in the Framework Review of Labour Market Statistics published on 5 August 2002 (see http://www.statistics.gov.uk/methods_quality/quality_review/downloads/LMSFR_Final.doc). A new labour demand indicator, jobs density, is included in these tables. The jobs density is the total number of jobs in the area (including employees, self-employed, government-supported trainees and armed forces personnel) divided by the number of working age residents of the area. The data in the Framework tables are annual, and come from a number of different sources.

As the new Framework tables contain annual Labour Force Survey (LFS) data, the table containing an annual local area LFS summary has been discontinued. Also, the tables giving monthly JSA claimant data have been retained for local authorities and parliamentary constituencies, but have been discontinued for travel-to-work areas and NUTS 3 areas. JSA claimant data for travel-to-work areas and NUTS 3 areas will continue to be available electronically, via Nomis[®].

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Interim Labour Force Survey (LFS) estimates consistent with the 2001 Census

Regional LFS estimates

The publication, in February 2003, of Census 2001-consistent population estimates at local authority level has allowed the production of interim regional LFS estimates for the first time. Regional estimates consistent with the 2001 Census have been produced and were first published in the April 2003 release.

The population data published in February only covered periods up to mid-2001. Regional population totals for 2002-3 are derived from two separate sources. Totals for the countries of the UK are based on the 2001 Census-consistent interim projections published by the Government Actuary's Department (GAD) in November 2002. Totals for the English regions are calculated by applying the growth rates from the published 2000-based sub-national projections (consistent with 1991-based population totals) to the revised regional estimates for 2001. The totals calculated for 2002-3 were then constrained to the interim GAD projections for England referred to above.

Interim regional estimates have been produced for all periods back to the three-month period ending February 1997. Regional level LFS time series for earlier periods will be compiled and released as part of ONS's full LFS reweighting exercise. Estimates for geographies below regions have not been reweighted using the interim method, but these also will be released as part of the full LFS reweighting exercise.

The methodology used to produce the interim regional LFS estimates is broadly consistent with that used to produce the UK interim LFS estimates. In broad terms, the old and new population data by age and sex were used to produce a matrix of adjustment factors for each region. These were then applied to the pre-2001 Census regional LFS estimates by sex and age. Where no age breakdown was available (as for full-time/part-time workers) these were scaled to the new reweighted totals.

Users of the interim regional LFS estimates should note that the interim methodology used does not achieve full additivity between the regional estimates and the national LFS estimates (though the differences are small). Full additivity in the series will be restored by the full reweighting exercise.

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Keeping LFS and population estimates consistent

During 2002, ONS introduced a new system in which interim, revised LFS time series, consistent with the 2001 Census, were published very soon after the publication of the necessary population data. Moving on from this innovation, ONS's aim is to ensure that its published LFS estimates continue to be kept closely in line with the latest published population data.

By 2005, re-engineered LFS systems will be in place that will enable the latest mid-year population estimate (MYE) to be incorporated into both revised LFS time series and revised microdata in September, following the release of each year's MYE in August.

In 2004, ONS will issue interim, revised LFS time series in September which incorporate the latest MYE published in August.

In 2004, also, the revised LFS microdata, and the final revised LFS time series based on this, will be published in November. This means that in September and October, the LFS microdata for the previous two years or so will not be consistent with the interim, revised LFS time series. It also means that the June to August LFS microdata will be released in November, consistent with the latest population MYE, rather than, as previously, in October. Moreover, ONS and the Government Actuary's Department will be working together to ensure that the population data used for revising LFS series and microdata are in line with the latest population projections.

While this had also been the intention for 2003, the announcement on 24 July that the publication of the mid-2002 population estimates for England and Wales was delayed from 7 August until 19 September has meant that alternative plans are now being considered. Revised plans for keeping the LFS and population estimates in line for the latest periods are now being considered and will be announced as soon as possible.

Each year's LFS seasonal adjustment review will be scheduled to coincide with the publication of the revised LFS microdata in order to avoid an additional occasion each year when revisions are made. Where the seasonal adjustment review has in the past taken place in the spring, it will now take place in the autumn. As a result, this year's review has been deferred until the autumn.

Claimant count rates

Following the recommendations in the LMS Framework Review, the workplace-based claimant count rates for sub-regional areas

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have been withdrawn from National Statistics and have ceased to appear in ONS publications. Users wishing to calculate the rates themselves will be able to continue to do so, using information readily accessible via the Nomis[®] website (<http://www.nomisweb.co.uk>).

ONS is now publishing local area claimant count figures as a proportion of the resident working age population for local authorities (and corresponding data for NUTS 3 areas are available on Nomis[®]), using the mid-2001 population estimates published by ONS on 10 October 2002. Comparable figures for countries and regions of the United Kingdom are also published.

Ward-level working age population data from the 2001 Census will be used to calculate and publish residence-based claimant count proportions for travel-to-work areas and parliamentary constituencies. The claimant count proportions for parliamentary constituencies will be published in the regional First Releases and on Nomis[®]; the data for travel-to-work areas will be available on Nomis[®].

The ward-level population data were published on 30 June 2003. Publication of the residence-based claimant count proportions for parliamentary constituencies and travel-to-work areas will be on 17 September 2003.

Tables 13 to 16: Local labour market indicators and Table 19: Comparison of pre-2001 and post-2001 Census population data

Tables 13 to 16 present a framework of labour market statistics for local areas. Data are presented as indicators of labour supply, labour demand and benefits. This structure adheres to the labour accounting system described in the Framework Review of Labour Market Statistics published on 5 August 2002 (see http://www.statistics.gov.uk/methods_quality/quality_review/downloads/LMSFR_Final.doc).

These tables include data from the annual local area Labour Force Survey. Interim reweighting of monthly LFS estimates at national and regional level has been applied in order to take account of the 2001 Census results. For the annual local area LFS data such an interim reweighting is not possible. These annual tables will be brought into line with the 2001 Census using the same full reweighting method to be applied to the main LFS. The timetable for revising the annual tables is currently being reviewed following the delayed publication of the 2002 mid-year population estimates from 7 August to 19 September 2003 (see note on page 7). For more information on the annual local area Labour Force Survey, see background note 4.

Table 19 compares the 2001 working age population projections for local areas included in this release with the 2001 Census-

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based mid-year working age population estimates for 2001. The table is intended to give users an indication of the magnitude of possible changes to estimates of labour force survey variables when revised estimates are produced. It does not contain sufficient information to accurately predict what the revised estimates will be.

Vacancy data

Publication of the Jobcentre vacancy series has been deferred due to distortions to the data as a result of the introduction of Employer Direct by Jobcentre Plus.

A limited range of statistics on Jobcentre Plus vacancies, relating to the inflows of newly-notified vacancies, is now being made available on Nomis[®], though not at this stage as National Statistics. (For further details see the news and research item on page 455 of the September 2002 issue of *Labour Market Trends*.)

The introduction of Employer Direct, a major change which involves transferring the vacancy-taking process from local Jobcentres to regional Customer Service Centres, has affected the data since May 2001. Employer Direct has been gradually introduced across Great Britain as part of modernising the former Employment Service (now part of Jobcentre Plus) and has had the following effects:

- A temporary reduction in the recorded level of outflows and placings owing to some delays in following up vacancies with employers associated with the introduction of the new arrangements.
- An increase in the recorded level of newly-notified vacancies.
- Both the above effects have led to an increase in the recorded stock of unfilled vacancies.

Investigations have shown that these effects are substantial for all the vacancy series. While they cannot be quantified precisely, the effects are large enough to prevent meaningful comparisons with earlier data. Some of the distortions will also persist for a while after the full implementation of Employer Direct, which was completed in all regions at the end of January 2002. Publication of the Jobcentre vacancy series has therefore been deferred. ONS and the Department for Work and Pensions are continuing to monitor and review the data with the aim of reinstating the series as soon as possible.

The publication of the vacancy figures for Northern Ireland has been suspended since March 1999 as a result of a discontinuity identified during the introduction of a new computer system for processing vacancies to local offices of the Department for Employment and Learning (DEL). In the course of correcting for this difficulty, further problems of a procedural nature came to light

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as contributory factors. These further issues have delayed the reinstatement of published vacancy figures for Northern Ireland. DEL have now introduced a new internet-based operational system for vacancies and have resumed publication of some non-seasonally adjusted vacancy data for Northern Ireland on a provisional basis.

Claimant count

The introduction of Joint Claims for Jobseeker's Allowance on 19 March 2001, and its extension on 28 October 2002, means that both members of certain couples are now required to claim JSA jointly and both are required to look for work. The claimant count continues to include all individual claimants, so there are some extra claimants included as a result of these changes.

Since 19 March 2001 Joint Claims for JSA has applied to couples without dependent children where at least one member was born after 19 March 1976 and is aged over 18. Joint Claims was extended on 28 October 2002 to couples without dependent children where at least one member was born after 28 October 1957.

ONS estimates that the introduction of Joint Claims had an initial upward effect on the claimant count, which accumulated between April and August 2001, of some 800 for the North West region at the time (approximately 300 men and 500 women). For the UK overall the initial impact was some 6,500 (approximately 2,200 men and 4,300 women). The total effect of the extension on 28 October has been to add a further estimated 450 claimants (100 men and 350 women) to the count for the North West region between October 2002 and February 2003 and 3,800 for the UK overall (approximately 900 men and 2,900 women).

The extent to which the introduction of Joint Claims may be treated as a discontinuity in the count, following past precedent, is difficult to assess but we will continue to monitor and review the effects. For information about previous treatment of discontinuities in the claimant count see, for example, the article 'Changes to the coverage of the monthly count of claimant unemployment' in *Labour Market Trends*, November 1995, page 398.

2. Some data in this release are based on statistical samples and, as such, are subject to sampling variability. If many samples were drawn, each would give a different result. The

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ranges shown for the LFS data in this release and in the following table represent '95 per cent confidence intervals'. It is expected that in 95 per cent of samples the range would contain the true value. For more information, see the *Guide to Labour Market Statistics Releases*.

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Interim reweighting of monthly LFS estimates at national and regional level has been applied in order to take account of the 2001 Census results. For the annual local area LFS data such an interim reweighting is not possible. These annual tables will be brought into line with the 2001 Census using the same full reweighting method to be applied to the main LFS. The timetable for revising the annual tables is currently being reviewed following the delayed publication of the 2002 mid-year population estimates from 7 August to 19 September 2003 (see note on page 7).

The annual LFS database is compiled by taking data from waves one and five of four quarters of the LFS and combining them with an additional sample of interviews. This sample boost was introduced in 2000 and has improved the accuracy of the annual estimates for some local areas in England and all local areas in Wales (a boost was also introduced in Scotland for the 2003/04 survey, and the results of this survey will be published in autumn 2004). There are now different publication thresholds for annual LFS data, depending on the size of the sample boost in the area. The thresholds are six thousand, four thousand, two thousand and as low as one thousand for some areas in Wales. For further information see Volume 6 of the *LFS User Guide*. A wide range of annual local area data from the LFS is available free from the Nomis[®] website at <http://www.nomisweb.co.uk>.

5. Not seasonally adjusted claimant count and vacancies data are gathered from administrative sources and constitute a complete count. However, seasonally adjusted totals are presented as rounded to the nearest hundred to avoid spurious precision. Any differences between the sum of the rounded seasonally adjusted figures and the UK totals are due to this rounding.
6. Claimant count flows are the number of people joining or leaving the count in the period between the count dates. They are therefore affected by the number of weeks between count dates. To enable comparisons from month to month, the flows figures are standardised to a 4.33-week month before seasonal adjustment.
7. The number of Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) claimants can be expressed as a proportion of either (a) the corresponding mid-year estimate (or the latest available mid-year estimate, currently for June 2000) of the workforce jobs in the area plus the number of claimants, or (b) the resident working age population. The number of workforce jobs is mainly collected through postal employer surveys and comprises employee jobs, self-employment jobs, HM armed forces and government-supported trainees and is used to calculate rates

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for regions and the countries of the UK. For smaller areas, proportions based on the resident working age populations are used.

8. The count of JSA claimants is mostly derived from the Jobcentre Plus computer records. However for various reasons, e.g. when a claimant's National Insurance number is not known, a few claims have to be dealt with manually by local offices. These claims, which amount to less than 1 per cent of the total, are thus counted separately and not analysed in as much detail as the computerised claims. In particular, only the computerised claims are analysed by age and duration on a monthly basis.
9. Travel-to-Work areas (Table 15) are approximations to self-contained labour markets, i.e. areas where people both live and work.
10. NUTS (Nomenclature des Unités Territoriales Statistiques) (Table 16) was established by the Statistical Office of the European Union (Eurostat) to provide a uniform breakdown of territorial units for the production of regional statistics. NUTS is a five-level hierarchical classification.
11. The employee jobs series is based on data from employer surveys and is subject to sampling variability. The nature of the survey means that the size of this sampling variability may not be consistent from year to year. Provisionally ONS would expect that the 95 per cent confidence interval would on average be within +/- 6 per cent of the estimate. However, this will vary from region to region.
12. Labour market statistics are compiled from a wide range of sources. Claimant count and Jobcentre vacancy data are provided from the Jobcentre Plus administrative system, workforce jobs are derived from ONS business surveys, other data come from the ONS Labour Force Survey.
13. The Social and Vital Statistics Division of ONS carries out the questionnaire design, sample selection and interviewing for the LFS. Analysis and publication of the results of the survey is undertaken by Labour Market Division. In Northern Ireland, the Labour Force Survey is conducted by the Central Survey Unit.
14. In addition to the data in this release, ONS can provide a wide range of detailed labour market data in a number of formats. In particular, data are available from Nomis[®] at the same time as this release is published. Further data are also published in *Labour Market Trends (LMT)* and the *Labour Force Survey Quarterly Supplement to LMT*.

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15. Some of the series in the attached tables are also available on the National Statistics website.
